
President – the Electoral Map




Democrats


o1 seat & no indication for caucusing

2012 Re-election Implications

- EPA's ability to enforce Clean Air Act remains intact
- Rules and standards to reduce greenhouse gas emissions likely to move forward
 - Carbon Pollution Standard pending
 - Coal Ash Standards pending
 - National Ambient Air Quality
 Standards (NAAQS) pending
 - Revised Ozone Rule in 2014 possible
- Direct climate action?
- Lessen dependence on foreign oil





2012 Re-election Implications

Key positions that may open

- Secretary of Energy
- Secretary of the Interior
- Secretary of Transportation
- Secretary of Agriculture
- EPA Administrator

Energy/Climate Team?

- o Formerly headed by Former EPA Administrator Carol Browner
- Unclear if formal administrative actions will follow





Looking Ahead > 113th Congress

- Dem Senate & Rep House no change in committee chairs
- Re-visit climate policy carbon tax is gaining some support?
 - Especially to avoid 'fiscal cliff'
- Nelson's win in FL = staunch opponent of offshore drilling returns





Looking Ahead > 113th Congress

- Dem majority in Senate: Yucca not likely to advance – nuclear expansion questionable
- 'Clean' Energy Standard (CES)
 - SACE webinar on January 15 to cover this topic in-depth

Wind Energy PTC/ITC

 hopefully extended before Dec 31 expiration to retain jobs from manufacturing & generation





Energy Policy in NC

- Threats to REPS? Very hard to say
 - There will be 51 new legislators out of 170 – difficult to predict anything
 - Possible bill(s) introduced to rollback the Southeast's only renewable energy standard
 - Hopefully it will once again fail to gain traction
